

Crochet Granny Triangle Flip Flops

These flip flops are quick and easy to work up, even for beginners!

Materials

- Flip Flops
- G Hook
- Sport Weight Yarn – I used Hobby Lobby's I Love This Cotton
- Tapestry needle to weave in ends



Abbreviations

- Beg – beginning
- Ch – chain
- DC – double crochet
- SC – single crochet
- Slst – slip stitch
- Sp – space
- St(s) – stitch(es)

Granny Triangle (make 2)

Create a Magic Circle (find a good tutorial for a Magic Circle [HERE](#), courtesy of Petals to Picots.

Round 1 Chain 3 in Magic Circle (counts as first DC here and throughout), 2DC, *Ch 2, 3DC*, repeat from * to * four more times, Ch 1, Slst to join to top of BegCh. NOTE: There should be a total of 6 “3DC” clusters on your Magic Circle

Pull Magic Circle closed, but do not cut off the tail until you have finished the triangle. The circle can sometimes loosen while you are working the triangle, so it's best to keep the tail until the end.

Round 2 Ch 3, 2DC in same ChSp, *Ch 1, (3DC, Ch2, 3DC) in next ChSp, Ch 1, 3DC in next ChSp*, repeat from * to * 2 more times, Ch 1, Slst to join to top of BegCh. NOTE: Each (3DC, Ch 2, 3DC) cluster forms a corner of the triangle.

Round 3 Ch 3, 2DC in same ChSp, Ch 1, *3DC in next ChSp, Ch 1, (3DC, Ch 2, 3DC) in next ChSp, Ch 1, 3DC in next ChSp, Ch 1*, repeat from * to * 2 more times but **skip** the [3DC and Ch1] at the end of the second repeat, Slst to top of BegCh.

Round 4 Ch 1, 1SC in same St, 1SC in next two Sts, *1SC in ChSp, 1SC in each of the next 3 Sts, 1SC in ChSp, 1SC in each of the next 3 Sts, 2SC in corner ChSp, 1SC in each of the next 3 Sts, 1SC in ChSp, 1SC in each of the next 3 Sts*, repeat from * to * two more times but skip the [1SC in each of the next 3 Sts] at the end of the second repeat, Slst to top of BegCh. Finish off, leaving a very long tail. This tail will be used later to sew the triangle to the flip flops, so be sure to leave more than enough length for sewing.

Be sure to go back to the Magic Circle tail and pull to close. I usually weave the tail in a bit to make sure it stays closed tight.

Flip Flop Straps

I followed a nice picture tutorial by Petals to Picots for attaching my yarn to the flip flop and single crocheting around the flip flop straps. You can find that tutorial [here](#). I crocheted approximately 40 SC on each side of the strap. You should crochet enough SC to cover the strap completely, so add more or less depending on the size of your flip flops. Weave in ends.



Attach your Granny Triangles

First, take your Granny Triangle and weave the long tail into the back of the triangle from the spot where you finished off to the middle of the corner (corner 1). Next, lay your triangle on top of the flip flop straps, with the next corner (corner 2) lined up to the point of the straps, and use safety pins to hold the triangle in place. Then begin attaching the granny triangle to the straps by using the long tail to sew them together with a whip stitch. Sew along the first side, from Corner 1 to Corner 2, then back up the other side from Corner 2 to Corner 3. Tie off and weave in the tail to finish.
